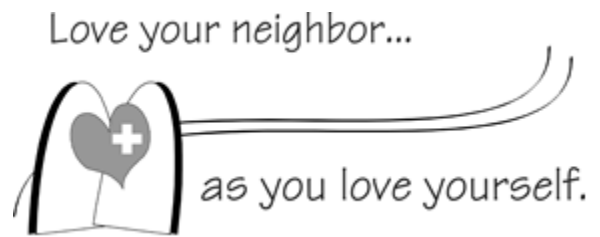

“You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel... But if you warn the wicked man, trying to turn him from his way, and he refuses to turn from his way, he shall die for his guilt... If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. No one likes to have someone tell him that they are doing something wrong, and many hesitate to offer correction. But the saying goes that the only way for evil to triumph is for good persons to do nothing. As we try to grow as Christians, we are obliged to speak up and speak out to change, whether individually or collectively.

Matthew offers the key to unity and change as he says, ‘if he listens to you.’ Listening allows us to think, deliberate, and then act. This provides the opportunity to join with the two or three, and discover that the Lord is present to resolve whatever difficulty. Yes, ‘the Spirit of the Lord present in me, greets the Spirit of the Lord present in you.’
