The Call to Carmel

“The call to Carmel, a call to seek God’s will in the ordinary circumstances of everyday life, roots Lay Carmelites in a love of those with whom they live and work, in the search for God’s presence in all circumstances, and in solidarity with God’s people everywhere.”

Provincial Atatutes 1.1.1

Lay Carmelites (Third Order Secular of the Order of Carmelites) are Roman Catholic men and women who “live in the footsteps of Jesus.”

Carmelite friars, nuns, and laity share this 800-year-old tradition of contemplative prayer, community, and service. It is a path to holiness embraced by St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Mary Magdalen de’Pazzi, Blessed Titus Brandsma, and many others.

Lay Carmelites meet monthly for a community meeting that includes Liturgy of the Hours, Lectio Divina, fellowship, and Carmelite spirituality related study topics,

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

First Reading: Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9

The Lord appears to Moses on Mount Sinai and proclaims to him that he Lord is a “merciful God...slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.”

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 13:11-13

Paul exhorts the Corinthians to live in peace and harmony, and for the first time, invokes the Blessed Trinity.

Gospel: John 3:16-18

In this beautiful passage, Jesus tells Nicodemus that God loved his people so much that he “gave his only son.” Jesus reveals to Nicodemus that anyone who believes in him will not die but will enjoy life with him for all eternity.

The Most Holy Trinity June 4, 2023

“Thus the Lord passed before him and cried out, ‘The Lord, the Lord, a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity.’ Moses at once bowed down to the ground in worship. Then he said, ‘If I find favor with you, O Lord, do come along in our company... receive us as your own.’”

We make the sign of the cross, we invoke the name of the Trinity, knowing we are a people of faith. The loving God, the creator, the redeeming Son and the animating Spirit, the one God in three persons.

May we take a moment to meet with Moses and his conversation in response to God’s self-revelation. That trinitarian God reveals Himself, speaking of a merciful and gracious One, rich in kindness and fidelity and the absence of anger and wrath.

Today think about those gifts God possesses and showers upon us. I am afraid we fail to know and love that God who like, with Moses, asks us to bow and worship.

As you make the sign of the cross, think about it as your worship of God.

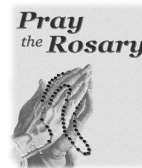
