The Call to Carmel

"The call to Carmel, a call to seek God's will in the ordinary circumstances of everyday life, roots Lay Carmelites in a love of those with whom they live and work, in the search for God's presence in all circumstances, and in solidarity with God's people everywhere." Provincial Atatutes 1.1.1

Lay Carmelites (Third Order Secular of the Order of Carmelites) are Roman Catholic men and women who "live in the footsteps of Jesus."

Carmelite friars, nuns, and laity share this 800-year-old tradition of contemplative prayer, community, and service. It is a path to holiness embraced by St. Teresa of Avila, St. John of the Cross, St. Mary Magdalen de'Pazzi, Blessed Titus Brandsma, and many others.

Lay Carmelites meet monthly for a community meeting that includes Liturgy of the Hours, Lectio Divina, fellowship, and Carmelite spirituality related study topics,

THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

First Reading: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a

Moses reminds the Israelites that when they were starving in the desert, the Lord fed them with "manna" -- a food not known to them.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Paul points out to the Corinthians that through the sharing of the cup and the breaking of the bread, they are all one in Christ Jesus.

Gospel: John 6:51-58

After Jesus feeds the five thousand people with barley loaves and fishes, he tries to make them understand the significance and the meaning of what he has done. He tells them, in mysterious and beautiful words, that the bread he gives is his flesh and says, "I myself am the living bread... If anyone eats this bread, he shall live forever."

"Then taking the five loaves and two fish, and looking up to heaven, he said the blessing over them, he broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. They all ate and were satisfied. And when the leftover fragments were picked up they filled twelve wicker baskets."

How would I have felt if I was in the crowd, listening and learning, and hungry? I sat down and observed Him taking and breaking, praying and blessing, and then giving to the disciples and they to the crowd. I reach out and gratefully accept this gift.

Take a minute and apply that scene to your presence at Holy Mass today. We are taught in the word and then watch, pray and listen as Jesus becomes truly present in the bread and wine — 'MY BODY... MY BLOOD.' NOT A SYMBOL BUT A REAL PRESENCE. Our faith focuses on His coming to me in the sacrament. When I leave liturgy, I too leave satisfied.

May I express my faith in His presence and reverently receive and consume the most important moment for Catholics.
